These hours included the help of the men of Community Service Alliance, and 8 students from Westlake High School Honor Society, who donated their help on Saturday and Sunday. We would also like to thank the staff of the library who made sure the sale was possible. A big Thank You to all of them for their help and support. We were able to raise \$10,000, which the Friends of Porter Public Library will use to fund various programs at the library throughout the year.

We have already scheduled the next Annual Sale for October of 2025. Until then, we hope you will visit our Book Nook sales room. The store is located in the main lobby. We are open Wednesdays and Saturdays from 10-2, Thursdays from 1-5, and Mondays from 3-7, so stop in and see our treasures.
